Dr. Welu taught at Clark and at the WAM for several years before joining the museum staff as an assistant curator in 1974. He served as the chief curator from 1980 to 1986 before becoming the director. He served in this position for twenty-five years. Welu retained oversight of Old Master paintings and taught on a continuous basis. A specialist in 17th-century Dutch and Flemish painting and cartography, Welu organized many exhibitions including Judith Leyster: A Dutch Master and Her World,

the first show of the most famous woman artist from Holland's Golden Age. In 2007 Hope and Healing: Painting in Italy in a Time of Plague, 1500-1800 was the first exhibition in North America to examine the response of the visual arts to the plague. Since 2011, Dr. Welu has served as Director Emeritus of WAM.

ENTRY FEE

\$35, for up to three works.

ARTWORK REQUIREMENTS

- All mediums accepted: 2D, 3D and video work.
- All work submitted must be available for exhibtion dates.
- Artwork that has been accepted into a CAA show within the past 2-years will not be considered.
- Artwork must be gallery ready.
- All wall mounted work must be wired for hanging.
- Work must be original, no reproductions.
- Weight requirements: total weight must not exceed 100lbs.
- Size requirements: must not exceed 96 inches on the longest side.
- Diptychs/triptychs are considered as a single work, and must be entered as a single jpeg.

Video requirement: For accepted video work, the artist is responsible for providing all necessary display and viewing equipment, including, but not limited to: display monitor, DVD player, mounting hardware, remote controls, batteries.

3D Work Requirement: Accepted sculpture must be accompanied by its own pedestal or method of presentation.

- Total weight must not exceed 100 lbs.
- Wall mounted 3D work must be wired for hanging.
